1. Purpose

The purpose of the Roadside Fallen Timber Collection Policy is to regulate and provide best practice and a consistent approach for the removal of timber from roadsides within the district. This Policy is also aimed to minimise damage to native vegetation on roadsides by persons interfering or removing vegetation from the roadside.

2. Policy Statement

Coorong District Council acknowledges dead timber will be found fallen on roadsides within the district and provides this Policy to ensure best practices are performed in relation to the various issues associated. This includes consideration towards the Native Vegetation Act, Fire and Emergency Services Act and Regulations, flora and fauna, habitat and safety for all within the vicinity, e.g. the permit holder and other road users.

3. Requirements/conditions for the collection of timber from roadsides

- 3.1 Authorisations for the collection of timber from roadsides within the Coorong District Council area will only be issued to residents or property owners of the Coorong District Council and must be for own private use by residents or property owners of the Coorong District Council.
- 3.2 Timber collected is not to be re-sold.
- 3.3 Prior to the collection of timber from roadsides, persons must receive a Section 221 authorisation approval from Council.
- 3.4 A fee, as set out in Council's Schedule of Fees & Charges applies to a Section 221 permit for the collection of fallen timber from the roadside. Permits approved are valid for a period of one (1) calendar month from the date of payment of the fee. The permit states that the holder of the permit will agree to indemnify and to keep indemnified the Council, its servants and agents and each of them from and against all actions, costs, claims, damages, charges and expenses whatsoever which may be brought or made or claimed against them or any of them arising out of or in relation to the issuing of the permit.
- 3.5 Permit holders must hold current public liability insurance (\$10 million coverage) and the insurance policy must be applicable to the activity being conducted.
- 3.6 Timber collection is only permitted on approved Council road reserves under classes 4B and 5 of Council's road hierarchy network. Collection is not permitted on class 2, 3 and/or 4A roads as listed at Appendix 1.
- 3.7 This Policy does not permit the cutting of live timber or the cutting down and/or removal of any standing tree (or attached branch) irrespective of whether the tree (or attached branch) is living or dead.
- 3.8 No hollow logs are to be cut, removed or tampered with in any way.
- 3.9 No cutting and/or collection of fallen timber is to occur on Total Fire Ban Days.
- 3.10 Use of any mechanical equipment, e.g. chainsaws are prohibited during the Fire Danger Season. The Fire and Emergency Services Act and Regulations must be adhered to.
- 3.11 Upon arrival, during removal and upon departure from collecting fallen timber from roadsides, care must be taken not to damage any surrounding native vegetation. Any vehicle, trailer or activity must not damage or destroy native vegetation along the roadside.
- 3.12 All applicable road rules must be followed whilst accessing areas along the roadside. The vehicle and/or trailer used must be parked in an appropriate manner that does not create a hazard to other road users whilst collecting fallen timber.
- 3.13 It is the responsibility of the permit holder to ensure a safe system of work is implemented for the gathering, loading and removal of timber from the roadside and in adherence with the Road Traffic Act 1961.

The permit holder MUST have the permit in their possession at all times whilst in the process of collecting and/or removing any fallen timber form roadsides or reserves.

4. Definitions

Roadside - Strip of land between the road formation and the boundary of the road which is usually the boundary fence of the adjoining property.

Road - Is a road within and under the control of the Coorong District Council but does not include a road under the control of the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure.

5. Availability/Accessibility
