Electric Fences

With the start of the fire danger season, Livestock SA is reminding those with electric fences to ensure these are well maintained, constructed as per the supplier's instructions and in accordance with the industry standards, and clear of undergrowth and overhanging bushes and trees. As electric fences have been attributed as a potential ignition point, producers with electric fences should consider turning them off on catastrophic fire days.

Rabbit control

Primary Producers SA is reminding landowners to maintain rabbit control programs. With the release of the K5 strain of the rabbit hemorrhagic disease virus and the ongoing appearance of the RHDV2 strain, integrated control programs that complement biocontrol are the best. This can include baiting with 1080 poison, followed up by a warren destruction program by mechanical ripping and fumigation and reopened holes.

Mallee emu-wrens return to SA

The first phase of a translocation program has seen Ngarkat Conservation Park become home to 78 endangered Mallee emu-wrens (Stipiturus mallee), only 4 years after they became extinct in South Australia due to the impact of large wildfires and drought.

The project saw 40 Mallee emu-wrens successfully released into the park in April, followed by an additional 38 birds in August. The birds travelled all the way from Murray Sunset and Hattah-Kulkyne National Parks in Victoria.
